This year, AMS is continuing the Newbery Club for interested 7th and 8th graders. The club will hold discussions online and meet in person every other Thursday after school

What we read

For a book to win the 2018 Newbery, it must have been written by an American author and have been published in 2017. The actual Newbery committee is looking for "the most distinguished contribution to American literature for children published by an American publisher in the United States in English during the preceding year." Our reading list will be by no means comprehensive. We have, or will have, most books in our collection. The books are picked based on recent reviews from around

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from 3:15 to 4:45 from September until the actual Newbery Medal winner and Honor books are announced by the American Library Association in January 2018.

If you are interested in joining, you must commit to reading enough eligible books by the time we hold our club vote in January. At our meetings, we will discuss the merits of specific books pertaining to the Newbery criteria. We will award our own AMS Newbery winner. And, hopefully, we will watch the real Newbery announced live in January.

Newbery Criteria

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- Interpretation of Theme

 It has great ideas that reveal important themes in a way that makes sense.
 - Presentation of Information -It presented facts in a outstanding way that helped me gain knowledge as I read.
- Development of Plot

 The plot is developed to fit together logically and believably.

 Delineation of Characters
 - -The characters are interesting and believable.
- Delineation of Setting

 The time and place of the story are well set and important to the story.
- Appropriateness of Style

 The language used is interesting and helps develop the plot and characters.

Most Newbery books should not be the most popular or teach the best lesson. A book may not be your favorite, but it should be the one that meets the criteria the best.

"Because the literary qualities to be considered will vary depending on content, the committee need not expect to find excellence in each of the named elements. The book should, however, have distinguished qualities in all of the elements pertinent to it."

Students will submit their reviews of books online prior to each meeting using discussion tools in Google Classroom. Students should know how to log into their WCPSS Google accounts!
